The Eighth of the Calends of January (Dec. 25)

The year from the creation of the world, when in the beginning God created Heaven and Earth, five thousand one hundred and ninety-nine: from the deluge, the year two thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven: from the birth of Abraham, the year two thousand and fifteen: from Moses and the going out of the people of Israel from Egypt, the year one thousand five hundred and ten: from David's being anointed king, the year one thousand and thirty two: in the sixty fifth week according to the prophecy of Daniel: in the one hundred and ninety-fourth Olympiad: from the building of the city of Rome, the year seven hundred and fifty-two: in the forty second year of the reign of Octavian Augustus: the whole world being in peace: in the sixth age of the world: Jesus Christ, the eternal God, and Son of the eternal Father, wishing to consecrate this world by His most merciful coming, being conceived of the Holy Ghost, and nine months since His conception having passed, in Bethlehem of Juda, is born of the Virgin Mary, being made man: The Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to the Flesh.




SUBMITTED ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Department of Philosophy and Theology and the School of Liberal Arts and Sciences at the University of Saint Francis invite you to a free public lecture as part of the 2016-2017 Philosophy/Theology Lecture Series. Dr. Adam DeVille, associate professor of theology, will give a lecture "ISIS and the Crusades: On the Uses and Abuses of History on Wednesday, January 25, 2017 at 7 p.m. on the campus of the University of Saint Francis, Brookside Ballroom, 2701 Spring Street, Fort Wayne, IN.

A century ago, almost no Muslim had ever heard of the Crusades, let alone viewed them negatively. Yet today ISIS propaganda is riddled with hundreds of justificatory references to "the Crusades" constantly calls Western and even Asian countries "the Crusaders." Dr. Adam DeVille, associate professor of theology, will explore the historiographical issues involved in such obvious and tendentious "memory," abuses of historical arguing psychoanalytic theories of trauma, screen memories, and misplaced rage may help to understand what is going on. Suggestions for countering this propaganda will also be offered.
