Appropriate Attire at Mass

Many have no doubt noticed the signs that appear on the inner doors leading into the church. The drawings thereon represent the minimum appropriate standards of dress for entering into the presence of God in his holy temple. However, assisting in offering the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass would seem to require more than simply the bare minimum standards of modesty in dress. The concept of one's "Sunday best" has become increasingly obscured in the present day, and we as Catholics aspiring to more traditional practices and observances might do well to revive the old custom of dressing just a little better than usual when assisting at Holy Mass. One should not take this as an opportunity to display one's wealth or extravagant fashions, but as a chance to acknowledge the special nature of what one is taking part in. We would certainly not have dinner with the President of the United States dressed in jeans and a t-shirt; nor should we take part in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass similarly attired. All this is not meant to discourage those going to or getting off from work (for example) from attending Mass in their work clothes. The benefits of assisting at Mass outweigh such considerations. However, when Sunday (or another day off) rolls around, the aforementioned should be given consideration before heading off to Mass.

Although most (possibly all) of the ladies attending Mass at Sacred Heart already do so, we should take this opportunity to reiterate that women are highly encouraged to cover their heads in church, a practice in accord with Apostolic Tradition and Sacred Scripture (see 1 Cor. 11:2-16). With due regard to time and circumstance, we encourage all to wear decorous attire befitting the sacred place and divine worship.

To help cut down on overhead, those contributing to the church by check are asked to please place their checks directly into the basket without an envelope. The envelopes are more intended for use by those contributing with cash who would like to receive acknowledgement for their contributions.

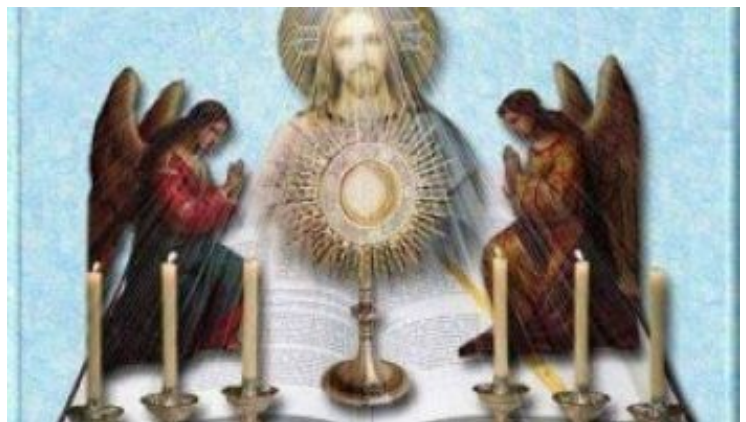

News from the Diocese

During the month of April, we celebrate national Child Abuse Prevention Month. It is a time: to re-commit ourselves to keeping children and youth safe in our homes, parishes and schools, to review our policies and guidelines for the safety of children, and to celebrate the children and youth in our lives.

The Catholic Church joins others across our nation in prayer and effort to end the evil of child abuse. In June, we will mark the fifteenth anniversary since the bishops of the United States wrote, The Promise to Protect, the Pledge to Heal which contains the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. In this document the church affirms the necessity to work for the prevention of child abuse and to help those victims of abuse heal. The Charter calls for annual audits of dioceses and eparchies to ascertain compliance with USCCB guidelines. Annual audits have been conducted since 2003. Results of the audits are published online in May for the public. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend has been audited twelve times, most recently on September 26-27, 2016 and found compliant with the Charter each time.
