



Message from Bishop Rhoades:

The horrible revelations about Archbishop McCarrick and the Pennsylvania grand jury report have brought forth a lot of anger and righteous indignation. So many have been shaken and disturbed upon learning of the awful sins and crimes that have occurred within our beloved Church.

You are not alone in asking the question: how do we move forward despite anger and disappointment? In the words of Saint Paul: "The love of Christ urges us on." This theme of the Annual Bishop's Appeal this year has particular relevance. It is faith in God and the love of Christ that impelled faithful Catholics to move forward. When there were times of scandal and corruption in the 2000-year history of the Catholic Church, the grace of the Holy Spirit moved powerfully, leading the Church to reform and calling her to greater fidelity to the Lord. Saint Paul clung to Jesus in the midst of many tribulations that he experienced before his martyrdom. Trusting in the Lord's love and mercy, we must move forward with the mission that we received from Him: our mission to evangelize, to educate and form our children and young people, to support priestly vocations, to serve the poor and needy, and to build up the Body of Christ in our diocese. 32nd Annual Bishop's Appeal

Our Annual Bishop's Appeal kicks off this week in our

parish. Our goal for this year is \$13,022.92. If we exceed our goal, the parish gets back 100% of the overage. Many people are aware that dioceses typically take a percentage of the weekly collection from every parish for their operating expenses. Many however, are not aware that this diocese keeps that percentage very low compared to other dioceses, some of which have assessments approaching 20% of the Sunday collection! Our Bishop relies on this appeal to run various diocesan programs and ministries including education of seminarians, pro-life activities, and works of charity towards those in need. UPCOMING SERIES \mathbf{ON} THE **SACRED LITURGY**

There will be a series of talks offered by the pastor on the sacred liturgy, covering the church, altar and its appurtenances, the vestments used, and finally the prayers and ceremonies of the Traditional Latin Mass. These will take place after the 6 PM Mass on 6 Wednesdays in the fall, (Sept. 26, Oct. 3, 10, 17, Nov. 7 and 14) and 6 Wednesdays in the Spring (to be determined). This is a great opportunity not only to learn more about the Latin Mass, but also to invite any friends or relatives who might have questions or curiosity, or even misapprehensions regarding the Latin Mass, and this may allow the pastor to be able to answer the same repeated common questions and objections that many people raise at various times and in divers places.

In order to make it easier for families to attend the teaching series on the Liturgy and the Mass, we will be providing a pizza dinner and beverages directly after Mass and before the teaching. To supplement the pizza, we are asking people to bring a salad/veggie type side dish if your last name begins with the letters A-L and a dessert if your last name begins with the letters M-Z. REGARDING PARISH FINANCES

All parishioners are once again reminded that any adult parishioner may inspect any of the financial records of the parish at any time (by appointment). includes not only deposit records, but also bank statements, invoices, receipts, and any and all documentation having to do with the parish finances. These records are not now —nor were they ever meant to be kept secret, despite what some may have been led to believe in the past. The pastor is easily reachable by email or telephone and replies to inquiries without equivocation or prevarication. The parish telephone is no longer manned, but voice messages from parishioners will be responded to swiftly, as a text transcript is forwarded to the pastor immediately.

Financial reports for the last 7 years are available on the table in the back of church (and have been for some time) and the intention is to leave a quarterly report there after the finance committee meets next. The next meeting will be Oct 13 at 9:45 (after Mass) in the parish office, and is of course open to the public. Our finance committee members are David McClamrock (Allen Co. deputy prosecuting attorney), Mark Johnston (Attorney and Brian Eichman (Certified Public at law), Accountant).
