

#### **Pastor Away**

The pastor will be out of town from Friday, Oct. 19 through Friday, October 26. Please extend a warm welcome to Fr. Daniel Mould, FSSP, from our apostolate in South Bend, who will be covering the Masses for the week.

**Please pray for the seminarians** of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, including our parishioner, Christopher Eichman, who will be tonsured on Saturday, October 20, 2018 in the Chapel of Saints Peter and Paul at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, Nebraska.

In the ceremony, the bishop will cut the hair of each one to be tonsured in the form of a cross, while the seminarian repeats with the bishop the words from Psalm 15: "The Lord is the portion of my inheritance and of my cup: it is thou that wilt restore my inheritance to me." Just as the sons of Levi, the Old Testament priests, did not have any land granted to them, so the one to be tonsured renounces worldly goods, and takes the Lord alone as his inheritance. Please pray for the seminarians to persevere in their vocational discernment.

# (Further information from the 1912 Catholic Encyclopedia)

The tonsure itself is not an ordination properly so called, nor a true order. It is rather a simple ascription of a person to the Divine service in such things as are common to all clerics. Historically the tonsure was not in use in the primitive Church during the age of persecution. Even later, St. Jerome (in Ezech., xliv) disapproves of clerics shaving their heads. Indeed, among the Greeks and Romans such a custom was a badge of slavery. On this very account, the shaving of the head was adopted by the monks. Towards the end of the fifth, or beginning of the sixth, century, the custom passed over to the secular clergy.

As a sacred rite, the tonsure was originally joined to the first ordination received, as in the Greek Church it still is to the order of lector. In the Latin Church it began as a separate ceremony about the end of the seventh century, when parents offered their young sons to the service of God. Tonsure is to be given by a candidate's ordinary, though mitred abbots can bestow it on their own subjects. No special age for its reception is prescribed, but the recipient must have learnt the rudiments of the Faith and be able to read and write. The ceremony may be performed at any time or place. As to the monastic tonsure, some writers have distinguished three kinds: (1) the Roman, or that of St. Peter, when all the head is shaved except a circle, of hair; (2) the Eastern, or St. Paul's, when the entire head is denuded of hair; (3) the Celtic, or St. John's, when only a crescent of hair is shaved from the front of the head. In Britain, the Saxon opponents of the Celtic tonsure called it the tonsure of Simon Magus.

# SERIES ON THE SACRED LITURGY CONTINUES

There will be a series of talks offered by the pastor on the sacred liturgy, covering the church, altar and its appurtenances, the vestments used, and finally the prayers and ceremonies of the Traditional Latin Mass after the 6 PM Mass for 6 Wednesdays in the fall, (Sept. 26, Oct. 3, 10, 17, Nov. 7 and 14) and 6 Wednesdays in the Spring (to be determined). This is a great opportunity not only to learn more about the Latin Mass, but also to invite any friends or relatives who might have questions or curiosity, or even misapprehensions regarding the Latin Mass, and this may allow the pastor to be able to answer the same repeated common questions and objections that many people raise at various times and in divers places.

In order to make it easier for families to attend the teaching series on the Liturgy and the Mass, we will be providing a pizza dinner and beverages directly after Mass and before the teaching. To supplement the pizza, we are asking people to bring a salad/veggie type side dish if your last name begins with the letters A-L and a dessert if your last name begins with the letters
