

## 32nd Annual Bishop's Appeal

The Annual Bishop's appeal is underway. We have so far gotten \$6155 (47%) in donations and pledges towards our goal of \$13,022.92. Online pledging or donation does not seem very popular this year. If we do not get a better response with pledges, we will be forced to do the in-pew appeal, which it was hoped we could avoid. If you still wish to pledge online you may do so at diocesefwsb.org/aba. Otherwise please fill out a pledge card and drop it in the collection basket. Please note that both sides of the card need to be filled out! No initial payment is required, as reminders will be sent monthly. It is very important that we reach our goal in pledges, as was explained at Mass last week. The parish is not budgeted for a shortfall in the Bishop's Appeal. Thank you for your generosity in supporting the work of the parish by helping it to meet its obligations to our bishop.

# Twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost

We are in the midst of a series of talks on the sacred liturgy, covering the church, altar and its appurtenances, the vestments used, and finally the prayers and ceremonies of the Traditional Latin Mass after the 6 PM Mass for 6 Wednesdays in the fall, (Sept. 26, Oct. 3, 10, 17, Nov. 7 and 14) and 6 Wednesdays in the Spring (to be determined). This is a great opportunity not only to learn more about the Latin Mass, but also to invite any friends or relatives who might have questions or curiosity, or even misapprehensions regarding the Latin Mass, and this may allow the pastor to be able to answer the same repeated common questions and objections. In order to make it easier for families to attend the teaching series on the Liturgy and the Mass, we will be providing a pizza dinner and beverages directly after Mass and before the teaching. To supplement the pizza, we are asking people to bring a salad/veggie type side dish if your last name begins with the letters A-L and a dessert if your last name begins with the letters M-Z. ## PER QUEM HAEC OMNIA (cont.)

(Taken from Notes Made at the Conferences of Dom Prosper Guéranger) Now let us see if this important rite can be traced up to the first centuries. It is certainly very ancient; it must have existed in all ages, as it is to be found everywhere. It can at once be understood that Holy Church, offering up her Spouse unto God, could never say that He is dead; she has immolated Him, it is true, but He whom she has thus immolated is living and this she must needs confess. Lo! now are accomplished the three great Mysteries, the Passion, the Resurrection, and the Ascension. That our Christ is indeed our very own, is what these three Mysteries truly express, and Holy Church right well remembers it. Before these were accomplished, there was not so much richness, if we may be allowed the expression. He was born at Bethlehem, but the Incarnation alone was not to save us, according to the designs of God; although it would have sufficed thereunto and superabundantly, if such had been the Divine Decree. Then, Christ suffered His bitter Passion, but that was not enough; there must be his Victory over Death, His Resurrection. There must yet be something more. Christ must open Heaven, He must have His Ascension; it needs must be, I say, that our human nature, which He deigned to take to Himself, in which He suffered, by means of which He subjected Himself to death, that this very human nature should be

throned in heaven, His Ascension, therefore, is a very necessity. So truly and indeed, He whom we hold in our hands, is the Lord himself, He who suffered, He who died, He who hath risen again, He who hath ascended into Heaven.

We do not accept telephoned or emailed requests. Everything must be together at the time the request is made. Please note that Mass stipends are NOT tax-deductible according to IRS regulations.
