32nd Annual Bishop's Appeal

The Annual Bishop's appeal is underway. We have so far gotten \$6155 (47%) in donations and pledges towards our goal of \$13,022.92. Pledges or donations made last week are not reflected in the above due to the pastor's absence. Online pledging or donation does not seem very popular this year. If we do not get a better response with pledges, we will be forced to do the inpew appeal, which it was hoped we could avoid. If you still wish to pledge online you may do so at diocesefwsb.org/aba. Otherwise please fill out a pledge card and drop it in the collection basket. Please note that both sides of the card need to be filled out! No initial payment is required, as reminders will be sent monthly. It is very important that we reach our goal in pledges, as was explained at Mass last week. The parish is not budgeted for a shortfall in the Bishop's Appeal. Thank you for your generosity in supporting the work of the parish by helping it to meet its obligations to our bishop.

THURSDAY, NOV. 1 — FEAST OF ALL SAINTS

This Thursday is the Feast of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be a High Mass at 7:00 PM. There will be no morning Mass that day.

FRIDAY, NOV. 2 — ALL SOULS

There will be 3 consecutive Requiem Masses beginning at 6:00 PM on Friday, Nov. 2. If you do not plan to attend all three Masses, estimate each Mass will take about 25 minutes for planning purposes. Note that current canon law permits the faithful to receive Holy Communion at up to two of these Masses, provided the second time one receives, one has assisted at the entire Mass.

The Young Ladies' Sodality will meet again on Friday, Nov. 2, at 4pm in the school building. Girls ages 6 and up are welcome.

All Saints' Day Party & Potluck

PLENARY INDULGENCES AVAILABLE FOR THE POOR SOULS NOV. 1-8

A plenary indulgence, applicable to the suffering souls in purgatory, is available from Nov. 1 through Nov. 8 under the condition of visiting a Catholic cemetery and praying for the souls of the faithful departed. An additional special plenary indulgence (under the usual conditions) is also available on Nov. 2 for visiting a church and praying an Our Father and the Apostles' Creed.

SERIES ON THE SACRED LITURGY

Note that there is a 2-week hiatus in our teaching series. The series will resume NEXT WEEK, Wednesday, Nov. 7.

There will be a series of talks offered by the pastor on the sacred liturgy, covering the church, altar and its appurtenances, the vestments used, and finally the prayers and ceremonies of the Traditional Latin Mass after the 6 PM Mass for 6 Wednesdays in the fall, (Sept. 26, Oct. 3, 10, 17, Nov. 7 and 14) and 6 Wednesdays in the Spring (to be determined). This is a great opportunity not only to learn more about the Latin Mass, but also to invite any friends or relatives who might have questions or curiosity, or even misapprehensions regarding the Latin Mass, and this may allow the pastor to be able to answer the same repeated common questions and objections.

In order to make it easier for families to attend the teaching series on the Liturgy and the Mass, we will be providing a pizza dinner and beverages directly after Mass and before the teaching. To supplement the pizza, we are asking people to bring a salad/veggie type side dish if your last name begins with the letters A-L and a dessert if your last name begins with the letters M-Z. First Friday and First Saturday

A reminder that this Friday and Saturday are First Friday and First Saturday respectively.

Our Lord made the following promise to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque: "I promise you in the ex-

cessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

Friday -- Confessions at 5:30 pm, Masses begin at 6 pm. Note: Because of All Souls Day, there will be no Exposition or Sacred Heart devotions this month.

Our Blessed Mother made the following promise to Sr. Lucia: "I promise to assist at the hour of death with the grace necessary for salvation all those who, with the intention of making reparation to me, will, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the beads, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary."

Saturday -- Rosary at 8:25 am, Confessions at 8:30, Mass at 9 am.
