



32nd Annual Bishop's Appeal

The Annual Bishop's appeal is underway. We have so far gotten \$10,940 (84%) in donations and pledges towards our goal of \$13,022.92. We are getting close but still have more to go. If you still wish to pledge online you may do so at diocesefwsb.org/aba. Otherwise please fill out a pledge card and drop it in the collection basket. Please note that both sides of the card need to be filled out! No initial payment is required, as reminders will be sent monthly. It is very important that we reach our goal at least in pledges, as was explained a few weeks ago. The parish is not budgeted for a shortfall in the Bishop's Appeal. Anyone who has not made a pledge or otherwise made an alternate arrangement should contact the pastor. Thank you for your generosity in supporting the work of the parish by helping it to meet its obligations to our bishop.

praying for the souls of the faithful departed. An additional special plenary indulgence (under the usual conditions) is also available on Nov. 2 for visiting a church and praying an Our Father and the Apostles' Creed.

SERIES ON THE SACRED LITURGY The series resumes THIS WEEK, Wednesday, Nov. 7.

There will be a series of talks offered by the pastor on the sacred liturgy, covering the church, altar and its appurtenances, the vestments used, and finally the prayers and ceremonies of the Traditional Latin Mass after the 6 PM Mass for 6 Wednesdays in the fall, (Sept. 26, Oct. 3, 10, 17, Nov. 7 and 14) and 6 Wednesdays in the Spring (to be determined). This is a great opportunity not only to learn more about the Latin Mass, but also to invite any friends or relatives who might have questions or curiosity, or even misapprehensions regarding the Latin Mass, and this may allow the pastor to be able to answer the same repeated common questions and objections.

In order to make it easier for families to attend the teaching series on the Liturgy and the Mass, we will be providing a pizza dinner and beverages directly after Mass and before the teaching. To supplement the pizza, we are asking people to bring a salad/veggie type side dish if your last name begins with the letters A-L and a dessert if your last name begins with the letters M-Z. FROM THE DIOCESE OF FORT WAYNE-SOUTH BEND

It remains important for our Church to protect children and young people from the evils of abuse. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend remains committed to upholding and following its guidelines, policies and procedures that were implemented for the Protection of Children and Young People. These can be reviewed on the Diocese's website, www.diocesefwsb.org under "Youth Protection."

If you have reason to believe that a minor may be a victim of abuse or neglect, Indiana law requires that you report this to civil authorities. If you or someone you know was abused as a child or young person by an adult, you are encouraged to notify appropriate civil authorities

of that abuse. The Diocese is committed to helping prevent the abuse or neglect of children and young people and to assist those who have suffered harm as a result of such abuse.

MASS REQUESTS

If you desire a Mass to be celebrated for a particular intention, please place the offering along with the specific intention in writing in an envelope clearly marked **Mass Intention** and place it in the collection basket. For intentions for a specific individual, make sure to specify whether the person is living or deceased. Alternatively, you can approach the pastor or bring or mail the request to the church. We do not accept telephoned or emailed requests. Everything must be together at the time the request is made. Please note that Mass stipends are NOT tax-deductible according to IRS regulations.
