



SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION — MARK YOUR CALENDARS

We have heard back from Bishop Rhoades, and we are scheduled for **Saturday, October 5, 2019**, at 6:00 PM. We plan to have the formal prayers and ceremonies attached to the episcopal visitation found in the pontifical. These ceremonies are a more elaborate way to receive one's bishop at the church, and include the sacrament of Confirmation. A reception will follow.

If there are any more that wish to be confirmed next year, please contact the pastor. The "preferred" age in this diocese for candidates for Confirmation is 13 or 14, but the US Bishops' Conference places the age starting at the age of reason and being postponed no later than the 16th year of age. A more mature understanding of the faith and the Christian life is required, but always proportional to one's chronological age. Some children,

being more precocious than others, might be well prepared at a very young age, and are encouraged to receive the sacrament earlier than the preferred age, which is after all merely a preference, not a precept. There will be a catechism class conducted based on Fr. Connell's Confraternity Edition of the Baltimore Catechism #3 and the booklet "Preparation for Confirmation" by Angelus Press, both of which will be provided by the parish.

FRANK SMITH ENDOWMENT

We have recently received a check for \$18,143 from the Frank Smith Endowment. This foundation was established by Harold Smith in memory of his brother Frank. Their parents Frank and Edith also added bequests to the foundation. Both Frank and Harold grew up on the south side of Fort Wayne. Ember Days

From the 1917 Catholic Encyclopedia

"Ember days (corruption fromLat. Quatuor Tempora, four times) are the days at the beginning of the seasons ordered by the Church as days of fast and abstinence. They were definitely arranged and prescribed for the entire Church by Pope Gregory VI (1073-1085) for the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after 13 December (S. Lucia), after Ash Whitsunday, Wednesday, a f t e r after 14 September (Exaltation of the Cross). The purpose of their introduction, besides the general one intended by all prayer and fasting, was to thank God for the gifts of nature, to teach men to make use of them in moderation, and to assist the needy. The immediate occasion was the practice of the heathens of Rome. The Romans were originally given to agriculture, and their native gods belonged to the same class. At the beginning of the time for seeding and harvesting religious ceremonies were performed to implore the help of their deities: in June for a bountiful harvest, in September for a rich vintage, and in December for the seeding; hence their feriae sementivae, feriae messis, and feriae vindemiales. The Church, when converting heathen nations, has always tried to sanctify any practices which could be utilized for a good purpose."

In former days, the Ember days were days of fast and abstinence (1 main meal, 2 smaller meals and no meat).

Although this discipline no longer binds Catholics under pain of sin, we have so little that does bind us under sin in the modern day that we would do well to observe these opportunities for additional penance. Although this year, the feast of St. Thomas takes precedence over Ember Friday, one may still observe it as a day of penance.

Opportunity for Girls

Our parish has provisionally invited the Sisters, Slaves of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, from the St. Benedict Center in Massachusetts to host a day camp for girls in the spring of 2019, if we are able to determine there is enough interest in such an undertaking.

The camp would likely be March 14-16, from about 8am -4pm each day. Activities would include Mass, talks by the Sisters, craft projects, the Rosary, and more. Girls ages 6 and older would be welcome.

The registration fee will be no more than \$50 per person, with the possibility of reduced fees for multiple children in a family, depending upon the number of attendees.
