SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION — MARK YOUR CALENDARS

We have heard back from Bishop Rhoades, and we are scheduled for **Saturday, October 5, 2019**, at 6:00 PM. We plan to have the formal prayers and ceremonies attached to the episcopal visitation found in the pontifical. These ceremonies are a more elaborate way to receive one's bishop at the church, and include the sacrament of Confirmation. A reception will follow.

If there are any more that wish to be confirmed next year, please contact the pastor. The "preferred" age in this diocese for candidates for Confirmation is 13 or 14, but the US Bishops' Conference places the age starting at the age of reason and being postponed no later than the 16th year of age. A more mature understanding of the faith and the Christian life is required, but always proportional to one's chronological age. Some children, being more precocious than others, might be well prepared at a very young age, and are encouraged to receive the sacrament earlier than the preferred age, which is after all merely a preference, not a precept. There will be a catechism class based on Fr. Connell's Confraternity Edition of the Baltimore Catechism #3 and the booklet "Preparation for Confirmation" by Angelus Press, both of which will be provided by the parish.

Opportunity for Girls

Our parish has invited the Sisters, Slaves of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, from the St. Benedict Center in Massachusetts to host a day camp for girls from **March 14-16, 2019**. The camp will run from about 8am-4pm each day. Activities will include Mass, talks by the Sisters, craft projects, the Rosary, and more. Girls ages 6 and older are welcome. The registration fee is \$50 per person.

First Friday and First Saturday

A reminder that this Friday and Saturday are First Friday and First Saturday respectively.

Our Lord made the following promise to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque: "I promise you in the ex-

cessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

Friday -- Confessions at 5:30 pm, Mass at 6 pm followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Heart devotions and Benediction.

Our Blessed Mother made the following promise to Sr. Lucia: "I promise to assist at the hour of death with the grace necessary for salvation all those who, with the intention of making reparation to me, will, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the beads, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary."

Saturday -- Rosary at 8:25 am, Confessions at 8:30, Mass at 9 am.

MASS REQUESTS

If you desire a Mass to be celebrated for a particular intention, please place the offering along with the specific intention in writing in an envelope clearly marked **Mass Intention** and place it in the collection basket or hand it to the priest. For intentions for a specific individual, make sure to specify whether the person is living or deceased. Alternatively, you can approach the pastor or bring or mail the request to the church.
