

FRIDAY, FEB. 2 — PURIFICATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY (DIA DE LA CANDELARIA — La bendición del Niño Jesús tendrá lugar después de la misa. ¡Vestir, no disfrazar!)

We will have a High Mass at 9:00 AM preceded by the blessing and distribution of candles and procession. This feast marks the end of the Christmas cycle, when our Lord physically went into His temple in fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy.

The candles blessed on this day symbolize Jesus, the Light of the World. The wax of the candle made by bees from the nectar of flowers represents the virginal flesh of Our Lord. The wick within symbolizes His Soul and the flame that scatters the darkness is His Divinity.

Third Sunday after Epiphany

Any candles that you wish to have blessed may be placed on or near the table in the sanctuary until the beginning of Mass on Saturday. Be sure your candles are labeled with your name. Blessed candles are a sacramental that may be used especially in times of trouble, temptations, during storms and for sick calls. Those blessed on this feast ought to be at least 51% natural beeswax.

SERIES ON THE SACRED LITURGY CONTINUES

We will pick up where we left off last fall with the Gloria and continue to the end of Mass.

A reminder that this Friday and Saturday are First Friday and First Saturday respectively.

Our Lord made the following promise to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque: "I promise you in the ex-

cessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

Friday -- Confessions at 5:30 pm, Mass at 6 pm followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Heart devotions and Benediction.

Our Blessed Mother made the following promise to Sr. Lucia: "I promise to assist at the hour of death with the grace necessary for salvation all those who, with the intention of making reparation to me, will, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the beads, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary."

Saturday -- Rosary at 8:25 am, Confessions at 8:30, Mass at 9 am.
