#### **Ember Days**

From the 1917 Catholic Encyclopedia

In former days, the Ember days were days of fast and abstinence (1 main meal, 2 smaller meals and no meat). Although this discipline no longer binds Catholics under pain of sin, we have so little that does bind us under sin in the modern day that we would do well to observe these opportunities for additional penance.

The 1960 calendar which we utilize tends to confuse the issue by ranking all the days of the octave of Pentecost equally. In fact, only the first two days, Pentecost Monday and Tuesday, were (and still are in certain European countries!) observed as major holidays.
