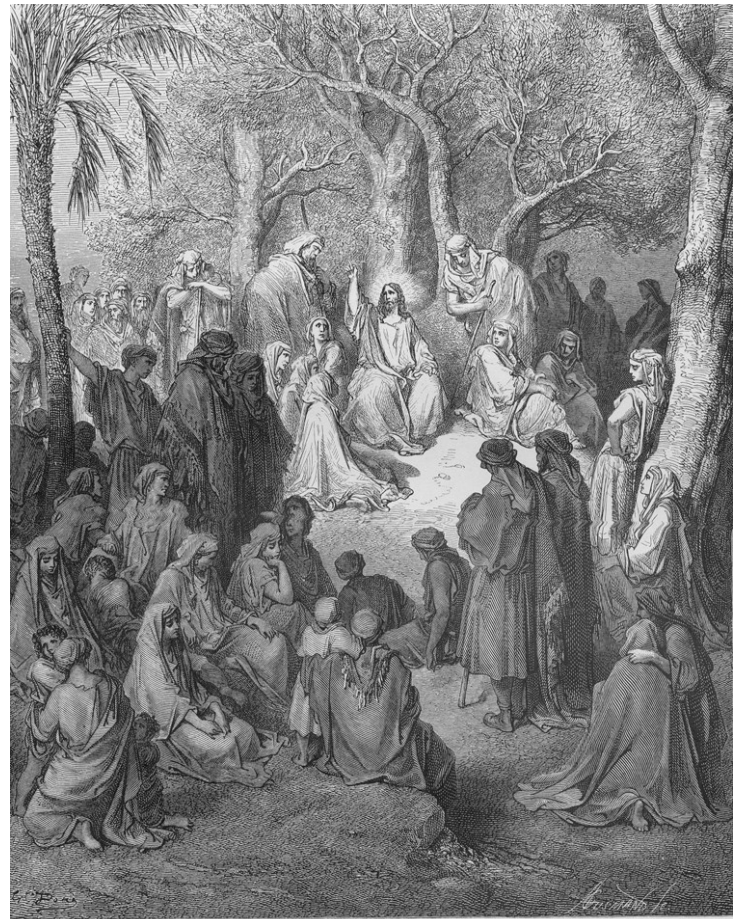

THIS TUESDAY is the commemoration of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. *(from the 1912 Catholic Encyclopedia)*
[E]ven should we admit that the small scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel originated even as late as the beginning of the sixteenth century, yet [Our Lady's] promise, which is designated the first privilege of the Carmelite Scapular, remains unimpaired. For this privilege declares nothing else than that all those who out of true veneration and love for the Blessed Virgin constantly wear the scapular in a spirit of fidelity and confiding faith, after they have been placed by the Church itself with this habit or badge under the special protection of the Mother of God, shall enjoy this special protection in the matter and crisis which most

concerns them for time and eternity. Whoever, therefore, even though he be now a sinner, wears the badge of the Mother of God throughout life as her faithful servant, not presumptuously relying on the scapular as on a miraculous amulet, but trustfully confiding in the power and goodness of Mary, may securely hope that Mary will through her powerful and motherly intercession procure for him all the necessary graces for true conversion and for perseverance in good. Such is the meaning and importance of the first privilege of the Carmelite Scapular, which is wont to be expressed in the words: "whoever wears the scapular until death, will be preserved from hell".

The second privilege of the scapular otherwise known as the Sabbatine privilege, may be briefly defined as meaning that Mary's motherly assistance for her servants in the Scapular Confraternity will continue after death, and will find effect especially on Saturday (the day consecrated to her honour), provided that the members fulfill faithfully the not easy conditions necessary for obtaining this privilege.

Enrollment in the Brown Scapular will take place after both Masses next Sunday for any who are interested.

DRESS IN CHURCH

Since a few people missed the public announcement, and it is possible a few others do not see the signs on the doors of the church, here is summarized the content of the dress code for the parish, approved by our bishop.

Entry to the church is forbidden for those not conforming to the minimum standards of Christian modesty, including wearing the following: Clothing with a low neckline, sleeveless garments which expose the shoulders, clothing that exposes the knees or upper legs (whether sitting or standing), clothing that exposes the stomach or back, or clothing made of see-through material. All this information appears on the signs on the doors.

Please note that this is nothing more than the minimum standard for appearing in public, let alone entering a Catholic church. For more information on the virtue of modesty and the true ideal to which we as Catholics should strive, please pick up a copy of the excellent pamphlet "Those Who Serve God Should Not Follow the Fashions," available at the entrances to church. Recognizing the difficulty women especially face in this endeavor, a helpful parishioner has compiled a list of vendors that she hopes others will find useful.

MASS REQUESTS

If you desire a Mass to be celebrated for a particular intention, please place the offering along with the specific intention in writing in an envelope clearly marked **Mass Intention** and place it in the collection basket or hand it to the priest. For intentions for a specific individual, make sure to specify whether the person is living or deceased. Alternatively, you can approach the pastor or bring or mail the request to the church. We do not accept telephoned or emailed requests. Everything must be together at the time the request is made. Please note that Mass stipends are NOT tax-deductible according to IRS regulations.
