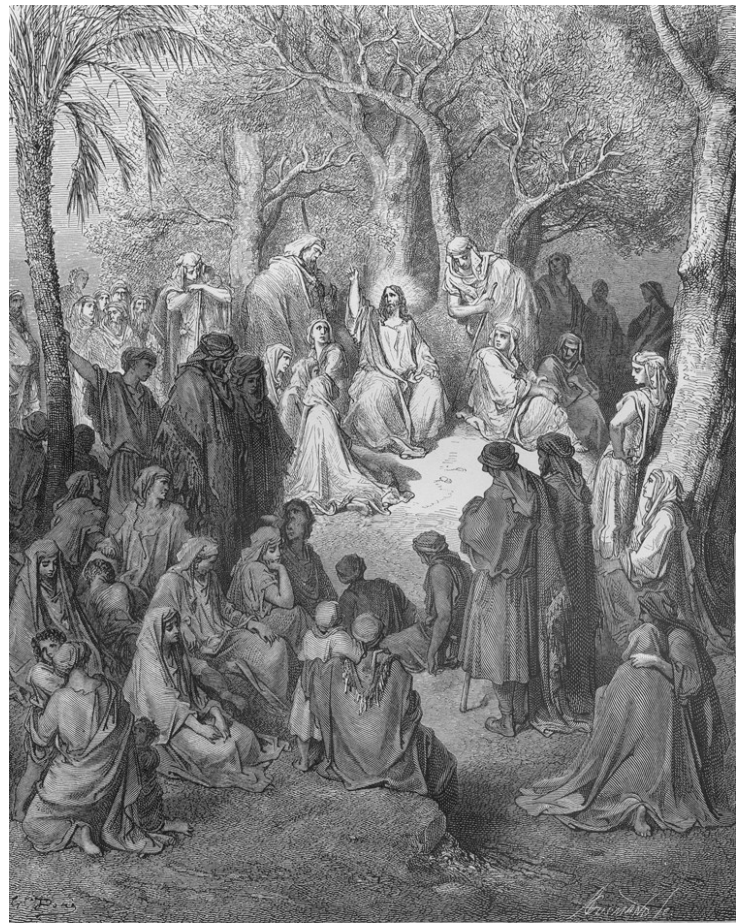

**33rd ANNUAL BISHOP'S APPEAL**

Our Annual Bishop's Appeal kicks off this week in our parish. Our goal for this year is \$14,574.08. If we exceed our goal, the parish gets back 100% of the overage. Many people are aware that dioceses typically take a percentage of the weekly collection from every parish for their

### MASS REQUESTS

If you desire a Mass to be celebrated for a particular intention, please place the offering along with the specific intention in writing in an envelope clearly marked **Mass Intention** and place it in the collection basket or hand it to the priest. For intentions for a specific individual, make sure to specify whether the person is living or deceased. Alternatively, you can approach the pastor or bring or mail the request to the church. We do not accept telephoned or emailed requests. Everything must be together at the time the request is made. Please note that Mass stipends are **NOT** tax-deductible according to IRS regulations.

### DRESS IN CHURCH

Entry to the church is forbidden for those not conforming to the standards of Christian modesty, including wearing the following: Clothing with a low neckline, sleeveless garments which expose the shoulders, clothing that exposes the knees or upper legs (whether sitting or standing), clothing that exposes the stomach or back, extremely tight-fitting clothing or clothing made of see-through material. All of this information appears on the signs on the doors.

For more information on the virtue of modesty and the true ideal to which we as Catholics should strive, various materials will be made available in the back of church. Please check from time to time for new arrivals.
