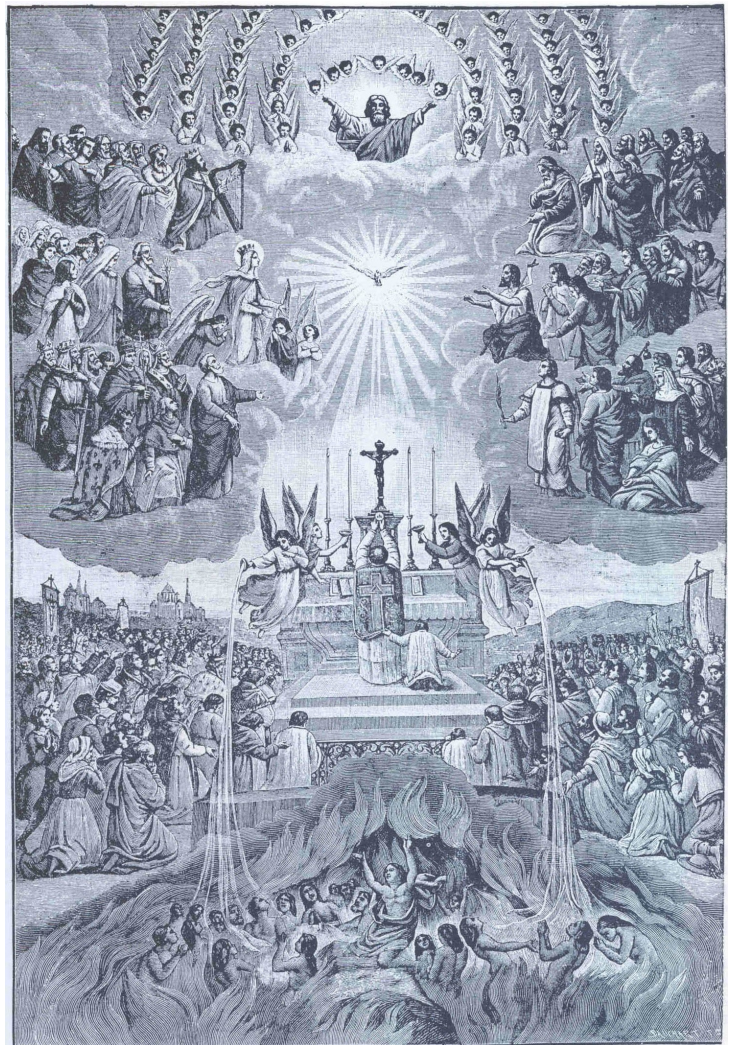

Indulgences for the Poor Souls

From November 1 to November 8, inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to Poor Souls in Purgatory, is

Twenty-first Sunday after Pentecost

granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed, provided the usual conditions are met. Only one plenary indulgence may be granted each day. The usual conditions to acquire a plenary indulgence are: 1. detachment from sin; which is a true sorrow for, and repudiation of, all one's sin, mortal and venial; 2. reception of Holy Communion on the day the indulgence is sought; 3. prayer for the intention of the Holy Father on the day the indulgence is sought (one Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice, or any other suitable prayer); 4. sacramental confession within 20 days completion of the prescribed work. If these conditions are not met, the indulgence will be partial.

St. Vincent de Paul "Brown Bag Collection"

Please continue to help our food bank here at Sacred Heart by taking a brown bag and filling it with non perishable foods. Please bring the filled bag back by the 2nd Sunday of each month and it will be exchanged with another empty brown bag. Please note that though the food bank has moved to St. Henry's for the convenience of the patrons, we nevertheless continue to assist it.

PROPER USE OF THE CRY ROOM

Although we have a cry room at Sacred Heart, we ask that it only be used in the case of actual blood-curdling screaming, the idea being that even very young children should not be deprived of the experience of the liturgy, especially in those years when it is making the greatest impression upon their rapidly growing minds. The "peanut gallery" in the back of church allows one to remain in the main body of the church while still permitting better mobility in case of emergency. The occasional sigh or whimper by a small child does not seriously distract the congregation, much less the celebrant. The following quotation from a recently published book may be helpful in understanding:

"It has often been noted that children seem more inclined to quiet — whether it be very young children playing quietly while Mass is proceeding, or older children attending quietly to it — at celebrations of the *usus antiquior* (i.e. Traditional Latin Mass). This can even be seen in the case of young children attending this Form for the first time. This is not surprising, since young children will not so easily understand the need to be quiet in an environment that is not itself quiet.

"For these reasons the removal of children from part of Mass for a paraliturgical 'children's liturgy' is alien to the *usus antiquior*, as is the use of sound-proofed rooms for small children, which separate them from other worshippers and, above all, from the atmosphere created by the liturgy. The ideal is, rather, that children absorb the liturgy and see adults they know and respect (ideally their own parents) assisting at it, as models to imitate. This also serves to underline the point, essential in holding the interest of children as they grow up, that the liturgy is not something to be left behind on approaching adulthood: it is an adult activity."

MASS REQUESTS

If you desire a Mass to be celebrated for a particular intention, please place the offering along with the specific intention in writing in an envelope clearly marked **Mass Intention** and place it in the collection basket or hand it to the priest. For intentions for a specific individual, make sure to specify whether the person is living or deceased. Alternatively, you can approach the pastor or bring or mail the request to the church. We do not accept telephoned or emailed requests. Everything must be together at the time the request is made. Please note that Mass stipends are **NOT** tax-deductible according to IRS regulations.
