There will be a sung Mass at 7 PM this Thursday to celebrate the feast of St. Joseph. There will be no morning Mass that day.

REGULATIONS FOR LENT

Lent began on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 26. The following are the barest minimum obligations which must be observed by Catholics under pain of serious sin (if there is no serious excusing cause). Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older. Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meatless meal. Two smaller meals, not equaling together a full meal, are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. If there are any questions about when one would not be obliged to this observance, please ask the pastor. The older regulations are given at the end of this bulletin for those who wish to observe Lent in a more traditional manner.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

There will be Stations of the Cross each Friday evening during Lent beginning at 6 PM, followed by Mass at 6:30 PM. Please join us for this special Lenten devotion.

SIMPLE SUPPERS—FRIDAYS OF LENT

We are offering a simple meatless supper on the six Fridays of Lent (February 28, March 6, 13, 20 & 27 and April 3) following Stations of the Cross at 6:00 pm and Mass at 6:30 pm. The Church will provide drinks and some of the food but we need people to pitch in and sign up to bring other dishes. There are detailed <u>SIGN-UP SHEETS for all six Fridays of Lent</u> on a blue clipboard on the table by the west entrance that specify what kind of dish to bring.
