STATIONS OF THE CROSS

There will be Stations of the Cross each Friday evening during Lent beginning at 6 PM, followed by Mass at 6:30 PM. Please join us for this special Lenten devotion. Normal First Friday devotions will be suspended during Lent.

FRIDAYS OF LENT

Friday, March 26, is the last Friday in Lent where we are offering a simple meatless supper following Stations of the Cross at 6:00 pm and Mass at 6:30 pm. Many thanks to everyone who has been contributing to these special evenings by bringing food, setting up and cleaning up afterwards!

REGULATIONS FOR LENT

The following are the barest minimum obligations which must be observed by Catholics under pain of serious sin (if there is no serious excusing cause). Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older. Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meatless meal. Two smaller meals, not equaling together a full meal, are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. If there are any questions about when one would not be obliged to this observance, please ask the pastor.

PRAYER BEFORE A CRUCIFIX

BEHOLD, O good and sweetest Jesus, I cast myself upon my knees in Thy sight, and with the most fervent desire of my soul I pray and beseech Thee to impress upon my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope and charity, with true repentance for my sins and a most firm desire of amendment: whilst with deep affection and grief of soul I consider within myself and mentally contemplate Thy five most precious Wounds, having before mine eyes that which David, the prophet, long ago spoke in Thine own person concerning Thee, my Jesus: They have pierced my hands and my feet, they have numbered all my bones [Psalm 21, 17, 18].

Say Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be for the intentions of the Holy Father. A plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions, may be gained by those who shall say this prayer with devotion after receiving Holy Communion on any Friday of Lent.

ORA ET LABORA

A list of small tasks as well as cleaning and maintenance needs has been put together and the standard cleaning crew and a few others of the parish would like to get together just before Easter to address them. We have about 10 people lined up as of now but would also hope for any others to stay after the morning Mass Saturday March 27, 2021 and help out if possible. We'd hope for about a dozen more people, including some to work from heights if they are willing. We plan to clean and wipe down the pews and windows in the church, then wash the inside of the windows from ladders and sweep and mop up the mess off the floors after. There are also some other small maintenance items to address in the school building, as well as cleaning up around the church grounds with trash bags. There are also plans to patch some of the asphalt from the winter damage, and tidy up the stairwells that fill in with trash and leaves every year.
