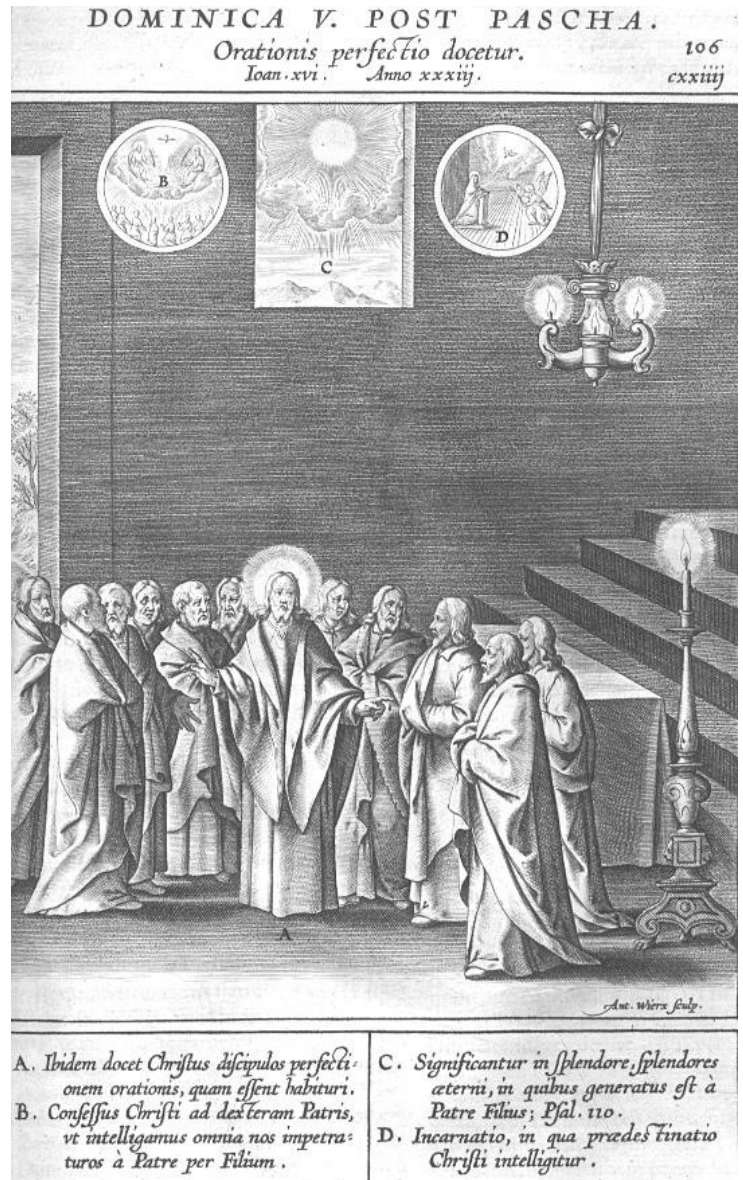

### LESSER ROGATIONS

“The three Rogation days preceding the feast of the Ascension were established by St. Mamettus, Bishop of Vienne, in Gaul about the year 450; these were days of prayer and penance to appease God's wrath, ask protection from the great calamities, and a blessing on the harvest – both the harvest of the gardens and the harvest of souls, for in either case unless the seed fall on fertile ground it will not yield good fruit.

Today Rogation days are associated mostly with prayer for blessing on the harvest - something about which all must have a vital concern, since there is no one who does not depend on it to sustain the life that is in him. Whether our food comes from our garden or the freezer at the supermarket, someone had to grow it; and before that God had to plant the mystery of life in the seed, or even the most skillful farmer could not make it yield.” - from *The Year and Our Children*
