


Active registered parishioners should contact the Pastor at least six Months in advance of the date.

EMBER DAYS

Four times a year, the Church sets aside three days to focus on God through His marvelous creation. These quarterly periods take place around the beginnings of the four natural seasons. These four times are each kept on a successive Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday and are known as Ember Days. These times are spent fasting and partially abstaining (voluntary since the new Code of Canon Law) in penance and with the intentions of

thanking God for the gifts He gives us in nature and beseeching Him for the discipline to use them in moderation.

The Ember days of Advent are known, in ecclesiastical antiquity, as the fast of the tenth month; and St. Leo, in one of his sermons on this fast, tells us that a special fast was fixed for this time of the year, because the fruits of the earth had then all been gathered in, and that it behoved Christians to testify their gratitude to God by a sacrifice of abstinence, thus rendering themselves more worthy to approach to God, the more they were detached from the love of created things.

Let us, the children of the Church, practice what is in our power of these admonitions; and since the actual discipline of Advent is so very mild, let us be so much the more fervent in fulfilling the precept of the fast of the Ember days. By these few exercises, let us keep up within ourselves the zeal of our forefathers for this holy season of Advent. We must never forget that although the interior preparation is what is absolutely essential for our profiting by the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, yet this preparation could scarcely be real unless it manifested itself by the exterior practices of religion and penance. PARISH CENTER — PLEASE READ

We are at a point where we need to create some new rules for the Parish Center: the kitchen, parish hall, big hall/gym, Library and the entire building. This is for the safety and well being of all members of Sacred Heart and we ask that parents are very clear with their children on these rules and that parents enforce them.

First, a big thank you to everyone who has been working at cleaning up after groups and events – there is definitely a noticeable difference. Here are new guidelines and rules that will be posted in the Parish Center Hall soon:

- -Families and individuals are responsible to clean their eating areas after every event, including Coffee and Donuts: Wash table area, wash chairs, sweep under table area and around chairs. There are buckets and rags in the kitchen that should be placed in the hall by event coordinators.
- -Children are not to roam and run around the building.
- -Parental supervision is required at all times in the big hall and toddler play area. Parents need to watch behaviors and redirect when necessary.
- -Children 10 and under may NOT be in the Library without an adult. No food or drink in the

Library.

- -No FOOD OR DRINK in the big hall unless there is a supervised event and clean up is expected as in the parish hall. Adults may take their coffee into big hall to supervise their children.
- -Kitchen: No children under 12 years of age in the kitchen unless there is an adult supervised project.
