

REGULATIONS FOR LENT

Lent began on Ash Wednesday, Mar. 2. The following are the barest minimum obligations which must be observed by Catholics under pain of serious sin (if there is no serious excusing cause). Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older. Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meatless meal. Two smaller meals, not equaling together a full meal, are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. If there are any questions about when one would not be obliged to this observance, please ask the pastor. The older regulations were given in previous Lenten bulletins for

those who wish to observe Lent in a more traditional manner.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

There will be Stations of the Cross each Friday evening during Lent beginning at 6 PM, followed by Mass at 6:30 PM. Please join us for this special Lenten devotion. Normal First Friday devotions will be suspended during Lent.

+FRIDAYS OF LENT+: We are offering a simple meatless supper on the Fridays of Lent (March 4, 11, 18, 25 and April 1 and 8) following Stations of the Cross at 6:00 pm and Mass at 6:30 pm.

The Church will provide drinks and some of the food but we need people to pitch in and sign up to bring DESIGNATED FOOD.

There are detailed <u>SIGN UP SHEETS for all Six Fridays of Lent</u> on a blue clipboard on the table by the west entrance that specify what kind of dish to bring. THIS IS NOT A REGULAR TYPE OF POTLUCK – NO DESSERTS AND ONLY BRING FOOD DESIGNATED ON THE SIGN UP SHEETS. *Please sign up to bring a dish on as many Fridays as you can*! PRAYER BEFORE A CRUCIFIX

BEHOLD, O good and sweetest Jesus, I cast myself upon my knees in Thy sight, and with the most fervent de sire of my soul I pray and beseech Thee to impress upon my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope and charity, with true repentance for my sins and a most firm desire of amendment: whilst with deep affection and grief of soul I consider within myself and mentally contemplate Thy five most precious Wounds, having before mine eyes that which David, the prophet, long ago spoke in Thine own person concerning Thee, my Jesus: They have pierced my hands and my feet, they have numbered all my bones [Psalm 21, 17, 18].

Say Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be for the intentions of the Holy Father. A plenary indulgence, under the usual conditions, may be gained by those who shall say this prayer with devotion after receiving Holy Communion on any Friday of Lent.

FIRST FRIDAY AND FIRST SATURDAY

A reminder that this Friday and Saturday are First Friday and First Saturday respectively.

Our Lord made the following promise to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque: "I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

Friday -- Confessions at 5:30 pm, Mass at 6 pm followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Heart devotions and Benediction.

Our Blessed Mother made the following promise to Sr. Lucia: "I promise to assist at the hour of death with the grace necessary for salvation all those who, with the intention of making reparation to me, will, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the beads, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary."

Saturday -- Act of Consecration and 15 minutes of silent meditation starting at 8:20 am, Rosary at 8:40 am, Mass at 9:00 am.
