FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART

We will celebrate the patronal feast of our parish with a **High Mass at 6 p.m. on Friday, June 24**. This year there is double the reason to celebrate, as the Vigil of the Feast of St. John the Baptist coincides with the Feast of the Sacred Heart. After Mass, outside the church, there will be a traditional blessing of the fire for the Vigil of St. John (which is a good time to burn any worn out scapulars or other blessed items that one might have).

He must increase but I must decrease.

The symbolism of the fire for the Vigil of St. John, which was typically watched until it went out late in the night, should be clear. At midsummer, the days are longest, representing the fullness of preparation for the coming of the Messiah. The chosen people had all the scriptures and the prophets, culminating in St. John the Baptist, greater than which there was none among the sons of women, as our Lord reminded the Jews. But He also observed that the least in the kingdom of heaven was greater than John. We contrast this the longest day of the year with the shortest, when our Lord came into this world in the flesh, in obscurity in a manger in Bethlehem, the bright light piercing through the darkness.

You're invited to a Eucharistic Procession and Festival in Warsaw as we kick off the three-year Eucharistic Revival for the Catholic Church in the United States.

June 19th, 2022 in Warsaw, Indiana beginning at 2:30 p.m. at Sacred Heart Parish. Prayer and Music followed by Departure at approximately 3 PM.

5 p.m. Benediction at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Warsaw, then Festival begins. 7 p.m. Festival Conclusion. Parking is available at the Kosciuszko County Fairgrounds and shuttles

will also be available to take people back to their vehicles.

NEW BOOK STUDY FOR WOMEN'S GROUP!!!

The pastor will be taking us through a 19-month critical study of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, Second Edition, promulgated by Pope John Paul II. It is important that we can talk about the truths of our Catholic faith, clarify ambiguities and refute what is not true about the Deposit of the Faith - at home with our children, in conversation with other Catholics and with people in general as the opportunity arises. Reading Guides will be available at the July 20th Women's Group meeting. Our Women's Group (Handmaids of St. Joseph) meets every 3rd Wednesday of the month and is publicized monthly in the bulletin.

You will need to order a Catechism if you do not already have one. We are using the big green one: *Catechism of the Catholic Church, Second Edition, revised in accordance with the official Latin text promulgated by Pope John Paul II.* You can find the Catechism second hand online for a good price, usually less than 10.00, or you can access it for free and read it on your Computer: <https://www.vatican.va/archive/ENG0015/INDEX.HTM>
