

NOV. 1 — ALL SAINTS DAY

This is a holy day of obligation. There will be two Masses offered on this Tuesday, Nov. 1, a low Mass at 7:00 AM and a Sung Mass at 7:00 PM

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 2 — ALL SOULS

As is our custom, we will have 3 consecutive low Requiem Masses beginning at 7:00 AM. Holy Communion will only be distributed at the first two morning Masses. Also, because we are blessed to have a second priest, there will also be a sung Requiem Mass at 7:00 PM.

Mary Alacoque: "I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who shall receive communion on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."

Friday -- Confessions at 5:30 pm, Mass at 6 pm followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Heart devotions and Benediction.

Our Blessed Mother made the following promise to Sr. Lucia: "I promise to assist at the hour of death with the grace necessary for salvation all those who, with the intention of making reparation to me, will, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the beads, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary."

Saturday -- Act of Consecration and 15 minutes of silent meditation starting at 8:20 am, Rosary at 8:40 am, Mass at 9:00 am.

MARTINMAS HOG ROAST

"Every pig has its Martinmas" (A cada chancho llega su San Martín) - an old Iberian proverb. Join us in celebrating this special feast of St. Martin (technically St. Martin of Tours, Nov. 11) on Saturday, November 12th beginning around noon following the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. This will be the first parish-wide communal keeping of this ancient Catholic feast. In earlier days it served as a marker for the coming of Winter as well as a kind of harvest feast akin to Thanksgiving. A hog will be roasted on the premises by the Troops of Saint George, and those who are able to attend are encouraged to donate to help with the cost of the hog (\$5 suggested donation per person). NOTICE ON PLENARY INDULGENCES

From November 1 to November 8, inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to Poor Souls in Purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed, provided the usual conditions are met. On November 2, All Souls Day, a plenary indulgence for Poor Souls will be granted to those who visit any parish church or public oratory and there recite one Our Father and one Credo. Only one plenary indulgence may be granted each day. The usual conditions to acquire a plenary indulgence are: 1. detachment from sin; which is a true sorrow for, and repudiation of, all one's sin, mortal and venial; 2. reception of Holy Communion on the day the indulgence is sought; 3. prayer for the intention of the Holy Father on the day the indulgence is sought (one Our Father and one Hail Mary suffice, or any other suitable prayer); 4. sacramental confession within a week of completion of the prescribed work. If these conditions are not met, the indulgence will be partial.

Adult Scripture class starting Tuesday September 27th. Fr Savoie will begin offering periodic series on the bible. An Introduction to the Bible and the book of Genesis will be the topic for this first session which will span 5 consecutive weeks. Mass at 1210pm followed by class at 1245pm.
