

Active registered parishioners should contact the Pastor at least six Months in advance of the date.



The Twelve Days of Christmas

Before is was popularized in a romantic Christmas carol the twelve days were the core of winter festivities throughout medieval Europe. The feast days with their octaves created a continuous celebration from Christmas to the Epiphany on January 6. Consider sanctifying your own Christmas season by incorporating mass attendance. We are blessed to have the relics of, St Stephen (26th), St John the Evangelist (27th), The holy Innocents (28th), St Thomas (29th), St Silvester (31st). During the Christmas season there will be a short sermon, exposition and veneration of the saints relics following mass.

Nativity of the Lord

Know that my thoughts and prayers go to all of you this Christmas season. Every year it is important for us to suspend worry and care and take effort to find joy amidst the trials of the world. To hear angels in the middle of the night, warmth in the cold, peace in the chaos.
