The camp will accommodate about 60 girls, with 4 or 5 Sisters to run activities, plus the staff needed to supervise and feed everyone.

+FRIDAYS OF LENT+:

We are offering a simple meatless supper on the Fridays of Lent (March 3, 10, 17, 24 and 31) following Stations of the Cross at 6:00 pm and Mass at 6:30 pm. The Church will provide drinks and some of the food but we need people to pitch in and sign up to bring **DESIGNATED FOOD** on the menu. There are detailed **SIGN UP SHEETS** for all six Fridays of Lent on a blue clipboard on the table by the west entrance that specify what kind of dish to bring. **THIS IS NOT A REGULAR TYPE OF POTLUCK – NO DESSERTS AND ONLY BRING FOOD DESIGNATED ON THE SIGN UP SHEETS.** Please sign up to bring a dish on as many Fridays as you can! PENITENTIAL LAWS: CURRENT PRACTICE

LAWS OF ABSTINENCE DAYS

- Begins one's 14th birthday
- Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent
- Obliges abstention from flesh meat

LAWS OF PENANCE DAYS

- Applies to all the Faithful
- Lent and Fridays outside of Lent
- *Penance is unspecified and not binding under sin*

LAWS OF FAST DAYS

- Applies to everyone aged 18 to 59
- One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

LAW OF EUCHARISTIC FAST

- One hour before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. Those who are able to maintain the previous discipline of the three-hour fast are still encouraged to do so.

PENITENTIAL LAWS: 1962 PRACTICE

LAWS OF ABSTINENCE

- Begins one's 7th birthday
- Complete Abstinence on all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and Vigil of Christmas.
- Partial Abstinence (meat and soup or gravy made from meat permitted once a day at the principal meal): all the days of Lent, the Ember Days of Wednesday and Saturday, and the Vigils of Pentecost and the Assumption.
- Abstinence from meat is dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation.

LAWS OF FAST DAYS

- Applies to everyone aged 21 to 59
- All days of Lent following Ash Wednesday, Sundays excluded, **Ember Days**, and Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost, and the Assumption.
- One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal.

LAW OF EUCHARISTIC FAST

- Complete fast from all food and alcoholic drinks for three hours before the reception of the Holy Communion, and one hour for non-alcoholic drinks (except for water, which can be taken at any time and does not break the fast.) Those who are able to maintain the midnight fast, which was the previous discipline, are still encouraged to do so.
