



# REMINDER ABOUT RULES IN THE PARISH CENTER

The kitchen, parish dining hall, big hall/gym, library and the entire building. This is for the safety and well-being of all members of Sacred Heart and <u>we ask that</u> <u>parents are very clear with their children on these</u> <u>rules and that parents enforce them.</u>

\*\*\*We do not have a custodial staff, so we need everyone to clean up after themselves and their children. <u>DINING HALL</u>: Families and individuals are responsible to clean their eating areas after every event, including Coffee and Donuts: Wash table area, wash chairs, sweep under table area and around chairs. There are buckets with cleaning spray and rags in the kitchen that should be placed in the hall by event coordinators. <u>PARENTAL SUPERVISION</u>: Children are not to roam and run around the building. Parental supervision is required at all times in the big hall and toddler play area. **Parents need to watch behaviors** and redirect when necessary.

<u>LIBRARY</u>: Children 10 and under may NOT be in the library without an adult. No food or drink and please pick up any toys and put them away.

<u>BIG HALL:</u> No FOOD OR DRINK in the big hall unless there is a supervised event and clean up is expected as in the parish hall. Adults may take their coffee into big hall to supervise their children.

<u>GROUP LEADERS</u>: Please make sure the kitchen and dining hall are cleaned according to the directions posted on the Pantry Door before leaving. Someone needs to be a point person for every group that meets.
