

Blessing of religious objects takes place after Mass on the third Sunday of every month. Please leave your objects on the designated table in the school basement.




Image: Caravaggio (1571-1610) Incredulity of Saint Thomas

AN OCTAVE COMPLETE

The Octave of Easter from ancient custom runs from the evening of Holy Saturday until the evening of following Saturday, hence todays collect puts Easter in the past tense, "we who have *celebrated* the Paschal Feast." This Sunday, "Quasimodo" takes its Introit from 1 Peter 2:2, "as newborn babes..." refering to those who have just entered the life of Faith by their baptism on Holy Saturday. Being now born again, one is now expected to nurture and grow in faith. Life in Christ does not terminate with Easter it commences. The Gospel for today forms a perfect capstone to the Feast of Easter and an introduction to the building up of the life of faith afterward. In John's gospel Christ appears to His aposltes on the evening of Easter Sunday and then again eight days later (today) with St Thomas present. Life after death is tied to having one's sins forgiven by those who were given the authority and faith is defined in believing the selfsame apostles' testimony concerning Christ. The newly born in Christ are to be continuously nurtured in the faith by recieving the sacraments entrusted to the apostles and must recieve continued instruction on the apostolic testimony. The apostles saw, heard and touched the risen Lord. Our faith is build upon hearing their testimony. This is how we come to be: "blessed are they that have not seen, and have believed."
