



### THE APOSTLES PHILIP AND JAMES

The joint feast of Philip and James derives from the dedication of Basilica built to honor the twelve apostles. Construction of the Basilica began by Pope Julius I, rebuilt by Pope Pelagius I, and finally dedicated by Pope John III (560-73) to the memory of all the apostles, and in particular of Philip and James, so that the two titles; "Basiclica of the Holy Apostles," and "The Basilica of the Apostles Phillip and James" were both in use for some time. The title of the Church, in conjuction with the difficulties of that time, created the association and the two names have remained a unit ever since in the Roman Liturgy.

The death of emperor Justinian in 565 left Rome abandoned and vulnerable as Constantinople turned it's attention to more immediate problems on the opposite frontier caused by the Persians and the Arabs. The power vacuum in the west precipitated the Lombard invasion of Italy which overran much of northern Italy. The Lombards threatened the survival of Rome itself, and reintroduced the Arian heresy throughout the Italian peninsula. Secular authority in shambles and orthodoxy besieged. Pope John III looked to the future and consecrated a Basilica—the first built in the city from scratch. As if the ending of a chapter hit and a new one was commencing. An ancient inscription relates the history of the Basilica's dedication and the difficulties currently pressing on the Church in the 6th century.

"His predecessor had scarecely begun this building which Pope John brought to completion. A great-minded Pontiff, in those days of trouble, he was not deterred by fear of the world's destruction, but against the storms of man he opened this harbor of safety, whilst he made perpetual supplication to God. A second John he was in name, in austerity, in thought, and in word, who wisely fed sheep committed to his charge. He built this refuge whither his people might fly to wscape from the fangs of the ravening wolf."
