



SIMPLE EXPOSITION

On first and third Wednesdays from 5-6pm, there will be simple exposition before Mass with confession available. Simple Exposition, or Benediction with the Ciborium, is a little ceremony which was more common yesteryear before widespread solemn exposition was permitted. Currently we do Solemn exposition and benediction after mass on first Fridays. I am adding simple exposition to our schedule for the hour *before* evening mass on the Wednesdays of the Men's and Women's group. This gives time for Confession, counsel, and silent prayer for those attending the groups while cultivating a larger practice of traditional devotions.

For simple exposition the tabernacle doors are open and a ciboria is moved forward "exposing" it for the laity. Six candles are lit on the altar and two are placed on the footpace. Benediction is with the ciborium hidden underneath a humeral veil.

Just as the irregularity of the 40 hours devotion facilitated a larger more fervent participation, so maybe will adding simple exposition lead to a deeper appreciation for solemn exposition on First Fridays.
